CHARTING THE COURSE WITH PASTOR AARON

In this volume of *The Good News*, you will see an article from the Generosity Committee introducing this year's stewardship campaign. Every year during the stewardship campaign, I create a sermon series tailored around the theme of the campaign. As you will read in the Committee's article, the theme this year is "Share God's Blessings" and was inspired by the words of Paul from 2 Corinthians 9:7: "God loves a cheerful giver."

Every autumn, we hear words like "generosity," "give," and "stewardship" connected to the campaign. As the Generosity Committee endeavors to make clear each year, and as I'm sure most of you know, generosity within Christian theology is a principle that permeates all aspects of our lives. Generosity is not a thing we do; it is a way we live. This is, in part, what the stewardship campaign is meant to remind us of every year. In my sermon series in October and November, I will elaborate on this point.

For four consecutive Sundays, starting October 22, I will be preaching on the following topics: "Cheerfully Giving Our Worship," "Cheerfully Giving Our Faith to Each Other," "Cheerfully Giving Our Faith to the World," and "Cheerfully Giving Our Resources." Generosity is evidence that God is transforming our hearts—it is a fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22). Theologically speaking, generosity means "always being ready to respond to God's leading." For that reason, our worship should be heartfelt and effusive, our nurturing of one another should be faithful and loving, our mission and evangelism should be eager and committed, and our giving should be meaningful and joyful. Generosity permeates our whole lives.

I look forward to this year of growth and transformation as a church, and I'm so grateful to be journeying alongside you.

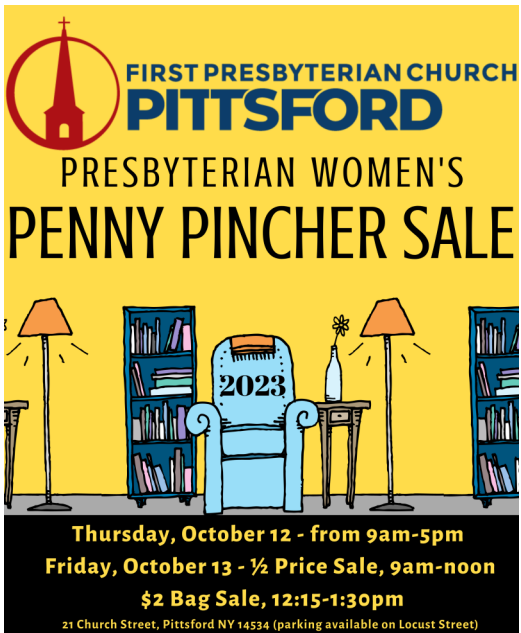
Fall Deacon Events

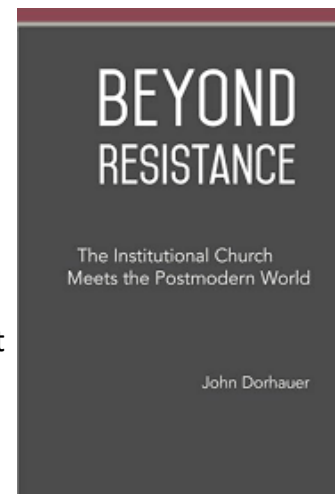

Children Join Adults for Communion

On Sunday, October 1, children have a great opportunity to be in worship during Communion. One of two sacraments Presbyterians celebrate, Communion is a very meaningful part of our worship which children may not have experienced before. We invite you and your family to participate in Sunday’s service and let your children experience all that our worship has to offer as they develop in their own spirituality. As usual, children PreK-5 will go downstairs to Sunday School after the Mouse Report. In Sunday School they will learn about the importance and sacred nature of Communion.

This instruction will contain four foundational concepts:

1. We participate in Communion to **remember** all that Jesus has done.
2. When we participate, we **join with Jesus** and all Christians at the table to eat like a family.
3. When we eat the bread or drink the juice we are **spiritually fed**.
4. The meal gives us the **strength** to carry on in the world.

After learning this, at the singing of the Doxology, children will come back into worship and sit with their parents. This way they can experience, and with your consent, participate in Communion. In the Presbyterian church, we believe that every baptized person with an understanding of Communion appropriate to their own abilities or age, is welcome to take Communion. We hope that this experience will nurture you and your family's spiritual growth. Please join us if you are able.
